The After-School Programs are offered, without cost, to any students in the Gloversville Enlarged School District's Boulevard, Kingsborough & Park Terrace Elementary Schools along with the elementary schools, Warren Street and Pleasant Avenue as well as the 5th & 6th grades in Knox Middle School in the Greater Johnstown School District.

A fee-for-service afterschool program is offered in the Fonda-Fultonville Elementary School. Any students in the appropriate grades are eligible to enroll. A fee for service before school program is offered for the Gloversville Enlarged School District elementary schools.

ommunity Oriented Recovery and Empowerment** can help you achieve your life goals and be more involved in your community. MHA offers the following services:

1. Education Support Services
2. Empowerment Services – Peer Support
3. Family Support and Training
4. Habilitation
5. Pre-vocational Services
6. Psychosocial rehabilitation (PSR)

CORE Services Eligibility

To be eligible for CORE services, individuals must meet the following criteria:

1. The individual must be enrolled in a Medicaid Health and Recovery Plan (HARP), HIV-Special Needs Plan (HIV-SNP), or Medicaid Advantage Plus (MAP) Plan.
2. The individual must meet the New York State Behavioral Health (BH) High-Risk Criteria, also known as the HARP Eligibility Algorithm, which is designated by the following codes:
 - o **H1:** Enrolled in a HARP and meets the BH High-Risk Criteria.
 - o **H4:** Enrolled in an HIV-SNP and meets the BH High-Risk Criteria.
 - o **H9:** Meets the BH High-Risk Criteria but is not in HARP or HIV-SNP.
3. CORE services must be recommended by a Licensed Practitioner of the Healing Arts (LPHA) based on the individual's needs.

HCBS Eligibility

For HCBS services, individuals must meet the following criteria:

1. Open to Medicaid beneficiaries aged 21 and older with serious mental illness (SMI) and/or substance use disorders (SUD). HIV-SNP enrollees who are determined HARP-eligible by the state may also qualify.
2. HARP-eligible individuals must be offered care management through a state-designated Health Home, which coordinates their services and support.
3. Individuals interested in receiving BH HCBS will undergo an individualized eligibility assessment using the NYS Eligibility Assessment (EA) tool. This assessment helps determine the specific services they qualify for based on their medical, behavioral, and functional needs.

Independence.

Daily living and Social Skills

- Gain or Regain life skills such as making social connections or budgeting
- Learn how to advocate for yourself and negotiate relationships
- If needed, receive treatment and rehabilitation services in your own home

Education and Employment

- Individual Employment Support
 - Choice of employment goal and benefit counseling
 - Support in finding and keeping a job
 - Support to help you stay on the job and start career planning
- Education support to start, return to, or graduate from school to learn skills to get or keep a job

**Single Point of Access for Children's Services (SPOA)
in Fulton & Montgomery Counties 518 762-5332 (ext. 115)**

The purpose of this initiative is to identify those children with a mental health diagnosis who are at the highest risk of an out-of-home placement and to develop, with collaboration of local service providers, appropriate strategies to assist and support these children in our communities.

Services accessed through Children's SPOA:

CHHUNY (Children's Health Home of Upstate New York): Health Home Care Management Services offered through Northern River's Family of Services (Parson's), 'Together for Youth' and RISE Housing and Support Services for children 5-18. The Care Manager assists in coordinating services and supporting individuals to decrease the need for inpatient admission and unnecessary ER visits.
